In addition 16 ebooks were launched in partnership with the Iberoamerican Observatory of Public Policies in Oral Health.

## Consensus on Periodontal disease and its impact on general health in Latin America

Post consensus activities have been in motion and reinforce our commitment to improve the oral health of the Latin American population. The 6 articles associated with the consensus have been accepted and expected to be publish in 2020 in the Brazilian Oral Research journal. Post consensus, we will continue to partner with local and regional associations to disseminate the consensus recommendations, along Federation with the European Periodontology Guidelines. (EFP)

So far, we have covered regional symposia in 9 countries: Argentina, Brazil, Colombia, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Mexico, Peru and the Dominican Republic. The activities were focused on the Consensus conclusions and the launch of the Periodontal & Caries EFP Guidelines which were presented in separate editions for each audience: Oral Health Team, Non-dental Professionals, Researchers and Population Guide plus an Info-graphic highlighting the importance of caries and periodontal disease prevention, which are among the most prevalent public health challenges in the world. The symposia were all well attended by dental professionals, government officials and key opinion leaders.

In addition to these initiatives, the Consensus recommendations were presented at the:

• First Congress of the International Association for Dental Research (IADR) - Caribbean Section

• Brazilian Association of Dental Education (ABENO) Meeting, responsible for over 400 Dental Education Institutions in Brazil.

This effort was possible by the strong alliance between LAOHA, FIPP (Ibero-American Federation of Periodontics), EFP (European Federation of Periodontology), SEPA (Spanish Society of Periodontics and Osseointegration), Regional Associations, COHI (Caribbean Oral Health Initiative) and Colgate-Palmolive.

For the next year, we anticipate we will participate in other events to continue this effort. In addition, this multi-centric collaboration will aim to share these and other guidelines to key stakeholders, academia, students and other health professionals across Latin America.


